*Patrik Meyer is a fellow with New America's International Security Program. He has eclectic personal, academic and professional backgrounds, which inform his multi-disciplinary research and narrow the gap between theory and practice in his work. He earned his Ph.D. in Politics and International Studies from the University of Cambridge working with Chinese scholars to provide better understanding of the conflicts in Xinjiang, China, that fuel tensions between the Uyghurs and the Chinese government. He also holds an M.P.A. in Development from Harvard Kennedy School, an M.S. in Structural Dynamics from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a B.S. in Civil Engineering from the University of California, Berkeley. Before commencing his academic studies, Patrik Meyer spent twenty years traveling the world, mainly through the Middle East, North Africa, and Asia, where he was deeply involved in Islamic and Chinese studies. Currently, he is a visiting professor at Gelisim University, where he conducts research and lectures on issues related to the Middle East and Islamic ethnic groups in China to help bridging ideological divisions between Muslims and non-Muslims.
